MESSAGE FROM OUR MAYOR



It was great to see our strong community spirit well and truly alive last month as we all pulled together following the severe weather that caused damage across Victoria.

High wind speeds resulted in trees down, road closures and over 4000 homes without power across Manningham.

Our after hours service received a large number of calls and provided emergency response assistance following the storm, including the clean up of fallen trees and debris, flash flooding and drainage impacts, road repairs and providing home care support to vulnerable members of our community.

We also set up community hubs to provide a place to get warm, have a hot shower, charge devices and stay connected and offered a free garden waste disposal service to help residents with storm clean up, which disposed of approximately 240 cubic metres of garden waste.

The storm event significantly impacted our neighbours in Yarra Ranges Council and we supported them by sending crews to assist. I am very proud of the efforts by our staff and community members as we came together to support each other during this challenging time. I also want to acknowledge the incredible work of the emergency services, and in particular Manningham SES and local CFA volunteers, as without them many people would still not be able to access their properties safely.

We've been busy working on our 2021/22 Budget. We've engaged extensively with our community and have listened to what you told us was important to you. The new budget ensures we are set to deliver for our community. With increased funding for trees, footpaths, bicycle strategy implementation, drainage, roads and investment in community facilities, you will see lots of work going on around the municipality over the next few years.

Other highlights include \$133 million to deliver more than 100 services for our community and a \$59 million Capital Works Program to maintain and enhance our \$2 billion of community assets.

We also recognise the ongoing impact of COVID-19 and are offering support for those going through financial difficulties. You can read more on pages 4 to 6.

Garden Waste Centre permanently closed

After 25 years of operation, our Garden Waste Recycle Centre has been permanently decommissioned and closed.

Following a 2018 review of the Victorian Government's Waste Management Policy, it was deemed that the facility did not meet the required guidelines and that it should be closed to minimise fire risk. In recent years several small fires ignited at the site, requiring the Country Fire Authority (CFA) to respond.

We continue to offer a garden waste bin to anyone with a residential waste service and still provide garden waste disposal services for residents in Bushfire Prone Areas. Find out more about the upcoming Garden Waste Disposal Days to service these areas in our story on page 6.

City Nature Challenge records bushland treasures

In May this year, our community helped us with a major initiative to record observations of flora and fauna across our beautiful bushland and in the process contributed over 650 biodiversity records to help inform researchers and land managers.

We were one of seven Councils across Eastern Metro Melbourne to join the City Nature Challenge, with a combined total of 7,629 biodiversity records in the form of photos and data.

We'd like to thank all the community groups that got involved in running events to get people outdoors for the challenge and to our 44 observers who recorded observations across our municipality.

We have included a small selection of photos (below) that were taken in our bushlands during the initiative.

This year's budget focuses on ensuring we deliver essential services whilst being aspirational and investing in things that matter to our community along with being financially sustainable over the long term. It also ensures we deliver on the first-year initiatives in our Council Plan 2021-2025.

We continue to beautify our City through a focus on our natural and built environment including investment in open space and facilities and services to support our resident's needs.

Following what has been a challenging year, we are considering future income streams and ways to maximise returns on Council assets to ensure we continue to be financially sound for future generations.

Significant planning and considered debate has been undertaken by our newly-elected Council to carefully determine our priorities and how to best meet the needs of our community.

Together with our accountable leadership, good governance, engagement practices and proven track record of getting things done, we will see the Manningham community thrive in the future.

This budget ensures we are set to deliver for our people, and envisage a brighter future for our diverse community.

INFRASTRUCTURE WORKS



\$59 million Capital Works Program to maintain and enhance Council's \$2 billion of community assets

- 17.5% increase from 2020/21
- Increased funding for bicycle strategy implementation and roads
- A significant investment in community facilities
- \$250,000 for additional traffic safety measures and related programs in Council owned activity centres and recreation reserves in light of recent accidents and budget submissions
- Install six bike repair stations
- \$12.52 million for roads (new and renewals) and road safety
- \$4.31 million for drainage (new and renewals) – an extra \$350,000 to 2020/21
- \$3.54 million for footpaths and shared paths – an extra \$250,000 to 2020/21
- \$10.79 million for building improvement and renewals – e.g. public toilets, preschools, libraries, halls, maternal child health. (*includes sustainability initiatives below)

We will provide \$560 million of services for our community and a Capital Works Program of \$223 million.

Our Capital Works Program includes:

- \$6.5 million on waste initiative projects to be funded from Council's Waste Initiatives Fund. This will include Food Organics Green Organics (FOGO), glass and other recycling initiatives and advanced waste processing
- \$1.5 million for solar panels and environmentally sensitive design for Council's buildings
- \$6.7 million to acquire land to create more parks, playgrounds, trails and open spaces
- \$21.6 million to maintain and improve our parks, playgrounds, trails and open spaces
- Resealing at least 100kms of existing roads
- Spray sealing eight kilometres of unsealed roads
- Rehabilitating 50,000 square metres of road
- Resurfacing 12,000 square meters of car park
- Renewing approximately 400kms of line marking
- Replacing decking on two bridges per year with low-maintenance, recycled fibre reinforced plastic
- Delivering 18kms of new footpath
- Delivering 30kms of footpath renewal
- Installing around 240 new streetlights, based on 60 requests per year
- Renewing fleet with over 50 more environmentally sustainable vehicles such as electric vehicles or hybrids

Garden waste disposal weekends



To support our residents in the Bushfire Prone Area, we are holding garden waste drop off days again over two weekends in August.

On Saturday 21 and Sunday 22 August and on Saturday 28 and Sunday 29 August, skips will be placed in local reserves in Warrandyte or Donvale, with locations made available after you book your place online.

Please note you will be required to show proof of residency (either a driver's licence or rates notice) to a team member at the check-in point on the day.

You will be able to drop off either one car boot, station wagon, ute, small van or a 6'x4' level trailer of garden waste.

Additional garden waste will be accepted at a charge (depending on trailer size), which must be paid by EFT on the day. Only one drop off is available per household.

Recognising a local hero

At just 17 years old and driven by a personal diagnosis, Zoe Petropoulos set up her own foundation, *Flicker of Hope*, in 2018. The foundation raises awareness and money for research in the treatment of neurofibromatosis (NF1) - a genetic condition in children that causes tumours to form in the brain, spinal cord and nerves. More importantly, Zoe wants the foundation to give people with the condition hope.

Zoe and the foundation raised more than \$600,000 in two years for a new drug trial and stem-cell research program with the Royal Children Hospital and the Murdoch Children Research Institute.

In 2019, Zoe was named our Young Citizen of the Year.

Aquarena makes mental health support a priority

As a result of the growing need for mental health support in our community, Aquarena has become the first leisure facility in Australia to have a Mental Health First Aider on site during all operating hours.

This move recognises the need to provide assistance to those in our community who are living with a mental health condition and ensures the centre can confidently provide the correct support to users of the centre.

When someone is having a mental health crisis, they could be having a panic attack, experiencing withdrawal, feeling suicidal, reacting to relationship issues, having a psychotic episode, or a mix of these symptoms. Mental Health First Aid can provide immediate assistance.

Aquarena is also proud to be working with the Belgravia Foundation to offer the *Take Charge Program*, a free referral-based program to help those with a mental health condition engage in 60 days of exercise at a leisure centre, followed by a negotiated co-contribution based on an individual's financial situation for ongoing access to the centre's facilities.

Placemaking program strengthens connections

As we've grappled with the various challenges caused by COVID-19, our Placemaking program has sought to build community resilience and make our neighbourhood villages more vibrant.

To help bring people together in December 2020, we installed four temporary pop-up parks at Jackson Court, Macedon Square, Templestowe Village and Tunstall Square. Supported by grants from the Victorian Government and Council, these colourful pop-up parks improved the look and feel of our shopping hubs, making them more attractive places to visit and to enjoy the outdoors.

We held 33 community events in these pop-up parks – including Christmas entertainment, live music performances, food trucks and cultural celebrations – and created ways for community members to meet in a COVID-safe way and support local traders. Additionally, three public artists worked with the community to develop artworks at Jackson Court.

We also offered funding to community groups, small businesses and individuals to host small scale events to make their own local neighbourhood spaces come alive.

This sparked the imagination of many people across Manningham and resulted in over 30 community-led projects and events including a community celebration at the Park Orchards Community House, and a free afternoon of music and theatre hosted by the Warrandyte Mechanics' Institute and Arts group.

Local traders hosted lion dance events to celebrate Chinese New Year and free Pilates sessions were held at the Jackson Court pop-up park. The Easter bunny visited the Templestowe Village shopping centre and the Wonga Park Community Cottage installed a welcoming new community outdoor dining area for the community to sit, connect and enjoy a cuppa.

On the back of these successes, a formal Placemaking Framework has now been drafted for consideration by Council to identify both short-term and permanent longer-term opportunities. We hope to continue working with local businesses, traders, residents and community groups to deliver community-led projects and events that foster a sense of place and connect our community.



A compliance reminder for swimming pool and spa owners

Property owners with a swimming pool or spa need to comply with the State Government's new pool safety legislation by having a registered building inspector check your pool and spa safety barriers to receive a Certificate of Compliance.

You need to supply us with this Certificate of Compliance within 30 days of receiving it. The lodgement fee is \$20.70.

This will ensure you follow the new laws introduced in December 2019 by the State Government to help prevent young children from tragically drowning in private swimming pools and spas.

If your inspector fails your barrier safety test and provides us with a Certificate of Non-Compliance, you will need to pay a \$390.80 lodgement fee to cover our costs of undertaking the required enforcement action.

To avoid this, we recommend that you do a self-assessment of your safety barrier to ensure it is properly maintained, prior to engaging your inspector. The self-assessment tools can be found at

Preparations have begun for bushfire season

Neighbourhood Safer Places (NSP), also known as Bushfire Places of Last Resort (BPLR), refers to a location that acts as a place of last resort when all other bushfire plans have failed.

In preparation for bushfire season, we have permanently decommissioned our four indoor NSP-BPLRs. This is due to the introduction of the National Broadband Network (NBN) in Manningham which replaces the former resilient communication infrastructure used for the indoor NSP-BPLR sites, and therefore has become unreliable for future use.

We have worked closely with the CFA and Fire Rescue Victoria to identify three open space sites nearby to these indoor locations. These open space locations are

- Dudley Road Reserve, Dudley Road, Wonga Park
- Domeney Reserve Pavilion Veranda, Knees Road, Park Orchards
- Warrandyte Skate Park and Basketball Courts, Tarroona Avenue, Warrandyte.

Now is the time to update your own emergency plans to include these sites and make sure you're well prepared for the bushfire season.

An NSP-BPLR is not an alternative to having an emergency plan or leaving early. While they may provide some protection from direct flame and radiant heat from a fire, they do not guarantee safety or survival. These sites have no shelter from the weather, no food, no water and no animal provisions – and emergency services most likely will not be there to protect the space.

Safe battery disposal avoids fires

Did you know that disposing of batteries in your bins can cause fires?

Batteries contain toxic substances that can start a fire in your bin, in our collection trucks or in a recycling facility. If batteries reach landfill, they can pollute our environment, leaking contaminants into the soil and groundwater.

To help prevent this, you should never dispose of batteries or items containing batteries in any bin.

Instead, you can dispose of household batteries at some Officeworks, Aldi or Battery World stores. For drop off locations visit

Nature inspires new Warrandyte playspace

Stage two of the Lions Park upgrade is set to benefit from a \$300,000 grant as part of the Victorian State Government's Local Parks Program.

Course to overcome independent living challenges

When people with an intellectual disability learn to live independently, their self-confidence often blooms. With this in mind, Manningham Inclusive Community Housing (MICH) has launched a 3-term course in conjunction with Pines Learning, called *The Skills to Help You Live Independently*.

Practical skills covered by the course include how to plan and prepare meals safely, washing and drying clothes and bedding, personal safety such as answering the door and coming home at night, Internet safety and buying a plan or mobile phone, intimate relationships and consent, socialising and friendships, banking and budgeting, and first aid.

MICH is also running parallel sessions for families on topics such as *Letting Go*, *NDIS Independent Living Options* and *Circles of Support*.

This program was funded by a Manningham Community Development Grant.
